Introduction

Geelong Sustainability Group Inc. is an apolitical non-profit community association established in 2007. Over the last ten years the group has evolved into a vibrant, well-connected organisation with over 1800 subscribers and several thousand Facebook supporters. Our reputation has been steadily rising built upon the consistent delivery of strong project outcomes and professional events. We were a partner in City of Greater Geelong's *Our Future* project.
